



The World Mission Offering (WMO) is used to support 2,500 short and long term missionaries annually, bringing U.S. and Puerto Rico churches together with partners in over 70 countries in cutting-edge ministries that tell the good news of Jesus Christ while meeting human needs. This offering is normally promoted and collected during the month of October, but you may also donate to the WMO anytime during the year.

Our giving to WMO helps people:



- Come to Christ
- Grow in Christ
- Change their world with Christ

There are three different options you may choose when designating your offering for 2009.

1. Give where your gift is most needed. You may choose the WMO line on your mission remit form and your gift will be directed to those missionaries and ministries in most urgent need of support anywhere in the world.
2. Give to a specific named missionary on the WMO line. Your gift will be directed support to a missionary who touches your heart. This usually will equal 68% of their total support needs. The remainder of total support needs (such as: housing, work funds and transportation) is an additional 32% average. This is covered by “where most needed” and other non-restricted funds.
3. You may also select a Ministry Focus Area and your gifts will support all the missionaries serving in that area.

Seven Ministry Focus Areas:

- Leading people to faith and starting new churches (17 missionaries)
- Training future church leaders (36 missionaries)
- Abolishing human trafficking (18 missionaries)
- Promoting health in an HIV/AIDS world (14 missionaries)
- Creating economic opportunity and building futures (10 missionaries)
- Opening the mind, empowering the heart (17 missionaries)
- Seeking peace and offering refuge (3 missionaries)
